International Avenue is a vibrant business district with a diverse ethnic composition located on 17th Avenue SE from 26-61 Streets in Calgary. The Avenue is also known as Calgary's Culinary and Cultural Capital.

It is an area of one-stop shopping with access to a selection of restaurants and grocery stores from around the world, as well as, a wide range of other retail goods and services.
